The Genesis of Good News To Walk with God Group Leader Guide

RECAP

Pastor Keith discusses the story of Cain and Abel from Genesis 4, focusing on the differing motivations behind their offerings to God. Abel offers his sacrifice in faith and worship, while Cain's offering stems from self-righteousness and identity in his achievements. When God regards Abel's offering over Cain's, Cain becomes angry. God approaches Cain, offering him a chance to correct his heart. Pastor Keith emphasizes true worship as coming to God in humility, seeking grace, and not through self-sufficiency. He invites the congregation to embrace grace, receive communion, and truly worship from the heart.

GETTING STARTED

What are some ways we might be tempted to bring offerings to God more like Cain than Abel, focusing on our own accomplishments rather than true worship?

- 1. What can we learn from the differing sacrifices offered by Cain and Abel in Genesis 4?
- 2. How does the story of Cain and Abel illustrate the concept of 'faith' in worship, as described by Pastor Keith?
- 3. Why do you think Cain's offering was not regarded by God, despite his belief in God?
- 4. Reflecting on your own experiences, have you ever felt like God did not accept something you offered? How did you respond?
- 5. How does the meaning of the names 'Cain' and 'Abel' enhance our understanding of their characters and actions?
- 6. What can we infer about God's character from His interaction with Cain after the offering was not accepted?
- 7. In what ways can we ensure our acts of worship are genuinely heartfelt and not just external practices?
